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






1.0 WELCOME

Welcome to the IAU Trail World Championships which will take place in Connemara, Ireland on Saturday 9th July 2011. Connemara is a spectacularly beautiful area in County Galway on the west coast of Ireland. The event will be operated in the area of Connemara National Park and its surrounding environs starting at the world famous Kylemore Abbey and finishing in the nearby village of Letterfrack. Athletes will cover a total distance of 71km, primarily in two large circular loops that encompass mountains, grassland trails, compacted gravel trails, loose rock trails and open countryside. The course is undoubtedly a tough one that could well suit 100km runners, long distance mountain runners and 24 hour runners alike, as well as dedicated trail athletes.

5.0 GENERAL COMPETITION INFORMATION

MIAUC IAU TRAIL WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

DATE: 9th July 2011 START TIME: 0700 hrs MAX. TIME: 11 hours

COURSE: TRAIL

Short Description of the Course:

Starting at Kylemore Abbey, near the village of Letterfrack, the course will leave the Abbey for open ground and run to Diamond Hill in Connemara National Park, which consists of two circular loop trails conjoined in the middle in a figure eight fashion. Diamond Hill reaches a height of 442 metres and rewards athletes with expansive panoramic views of all of the Connemara area, including the Twelve Ben Mountains, Kylemore Abbey and Kylemore Lough, which the runners will encounter later in the course.

Following their descent from Diamond Hill summit, the athletes will twice run a loop of approximately 32km where they will encounter open ground, bog, conventional trail paths, streams, forest and mountains for a true trail run in nature. They will have to negotiate Benbaun Mountain on each loop, which has a summit height of 729 metres.

PROFILE: Highest Point = 729 metres.





9.0 AID STATIONS & MOBILE COMMUNICATIONS

There will be 3 aid stations on the course. Please refer to the map under Section 6.0 which illustrates the first large circuit. Aid stations will be positioned at kilometre 4 (finish area); kilometre 15 and kilometre 30 approximately and these aid stations will encountered twice by athletes. Assistants can be transported to these aid stations prior to the start of the race: the stations are all accessible by road. However, assistants should plan on being positioned at these stations for the entire duration of the race unless they have their own transport or are prepared to walk back along the course to the finish area. Furthermore, it should be noted that mobile phones are unlikely to work except in the finish area.

11.0 ENTRIES



The IAU invites all member federations to participate in the IAU Trail World Championships. The event is both an individual and team competition. Men's and women's teams can comprise a maximum of 6 people with 3 to score. Each federation can send a maximum of 9 male and 9 female competitors, e.g. a full team + 3 individual athletes. Competitors in the team competition will automatically count in the individual race. Team positions are decided on the basis of the cumulative time of the top three finishers.

FINAL ENTRY FORMS (FEF's) should be completed and sent, before June 1st.

With the final entry form, each Federation will send the **final** list with the names of their athletes, dates of birth, sex and current personal bests for 100K and will inform the LOC about the travel itinerary details of the delegation members (arrival and departure times, flight numbers, required number of rooms, required number of nights, required number of meals to be provided)

Please note that the travel and accommodation offers made by the LOC are conditional on the prompt return of the entry forms within the deadlines.

An open race will operate concurrently with the IAU Trail world Championships, but only contestants entered by their national federations will be counted in the results of the IAU Trail World Championships.

Entries for the open race will be available through www.runconnemara.com from the beginning of May. All applicants from outside of Ireland will be guaranteed entry and can make travel plans to take part.







12.0 TRAVEL INFORMATION AND TRANSPORTATION PLAN



National federations will be transported from Galway City to the race location where they will be accommodated in the immediate vicinity of Letterfrack, Renvyle and Clifden. Galway City is easily accessible by rail or bus from the major airports of Dublin and Shannon and also has an airport itself, which serves many British cities. The exact place in town for pick-up will depend on where federations arrive. The LOC will endeavour to pick federations up from their exact arrival location, e.g. the airport or the bus station or the train station. Each delegation will be individually contacted with the plan once all arrival details are delared in the FEF. An information pack will also be available at their accommodation on arrival.

HOW TO TRAVEL TO GALWAY

AIR

<u>Dublin Airport</u> (DUB) is Ireland's major airport and serves a variety of destinations via multiple carriers. It is located on the East coast of Ireland (220km) and it is possible to easily connect to Galway by bus, car or rail.

Galway Airport (GWY) is located 6km from the city centre. Aer Arann operates flights to Galway Airport from London (Luton), Manchester and Edinburgh as well as other cities in Ireland & continental Europe. Return flights from the UK cost approximately GBP100 (including taxes) and it is possible to book directly on the Aer Arann website.

Shannon International Airport (SNN) is located 85km from Galway and has routes servicing numerous destinations in the UK and Europe, including London Gatwick and London Stansted. The low fare airline, Ryan Air, serves the latter routes along with other UK cities. It is possible to connect to Galway by bus or car hire.

Ireland West Airport Knock (NOC) is 80km from Galway and

also has direct connections to a number of UK destinations, including London Gatwick and London Stansted. These are operated by <u>BMI</u>, <u>Aer Lingus</u> and <u>Ryan Air</u>. It is possible to connect to Galway via bus or car hire.



ROAD

Galway is serviced by 3 national primary routes - N17 to the North (Sligo & Donegal), N6 to the East (Athlone & Dublin), N18 to the South (Shannon, Limerick and Cork). The M6 is Ireland's only complete motorway connecting two major urban areas and transit time is 2hrs.

RAIL

There are seven return services from Dublin Heuston Station daily (approx. 2.5 hrs travel time). See <u>Irish Rail</u> for details. Galway's railway station (Ceannt Station) is located in the city centre and close to all accommodation and the Race HQ.







BUS

The national bus company <u>Bus Éireann</u> and several private bus operators, including <u>Citylink</u> and <u>Go Bus</u> operate regular daily services to/from Galway (and service Dublin Airport and Shannon Airport).



BOAT

The closest ferry ports include Dublin, Rosslare (4 hours travel time by road) and Cork (3.5 hours travel time by road).

CAR RENTAL

Most major car hire companies operate from airports and seaports in Ireland.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT CONNECTIONS FROM DUBLIN AIRPORT TO GALWAY

The easiest means to connect from Dublin Airport to Galway is by bus. Citylink operates a direct coach service. The bus service is available almost every hour and the transit time is a mere 2 ¼ hours. Please see http://www.citylink.ie/ for details and timetables.

GoBus also operates a direct service to Galway. Please see http://www.gobus.ie/ for details.

Between Citylink and GoBus there is a direct service from Dublin Airport to Galway almost every 30 minutes.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT CONNECTIONS FROM SHANNON AIRPORT TO GALWAY

Citylink operates from Shannon Airport to Galway. However, there is a limited schedule. Please see http://www.citylink.ie/ for details and timetables.

Bus Eireann also operates from Shannon Airport to Galway, but it is not an express service and incorporates a few stops en route. Please see http://www.buseireann.ie for details.

GENERAL ADVICE / PICK-UPS IN GALWAY

Once the LOC is notified of flight arrival and departure details, the LOC will arrange transportation options and pick-ups as appropriate. The exact place for pick-up will depend on where the runners arrive.







13.0 ACCOMMODATION



Invited athletes will be accommodated in selected hotels / guesthouses/ hostels in the **Letterfrack, Renvyle, Leenane** and **Clifden** areas.

The Local Organising Committee (LOC) will guarantee:

- full board accommodation, free of charge, for 3 male and 3 female athletes as follows:
- 3 nights for those who are within 4 hours flying time from their capital city to Dublin
- 4 nights for those who must fly at least 4 hours but less than 9 h to Dublin
- 5 nights for those who must fly a minimum of 9 h from their capital city to Dublin

Accommodation can be arranged for additional **athletes**, **assistants** and **coaches** (not free of charge) for a maximum of 9 male and 9 female athletes per delegation and a maximum of 3, 6 or 9 officials per delegation as set out below.

- Max. 3 officials when 1-6 athletes/delegation
- Max. 6 officials when 7-12 athletes/delegation
- Max. 9 officials when 13-18 athletes/delegation

Examples of hostel-type accommodation to be utilised for the event include <u>Sleepzone</u> and the <u>Letterfrack</u> <u>Lodge</u>. Teams will be accommodated together and the cost of full board accommodation (for athletes / officials not paid for by the LOC) should be in the €50 - €70 range per night, depending on accommodation type. B&B would be approximately €35.

A detailed list of accommodation options will be placed on www.runconnemara.com during the first two weeks of May. In the meantime, please see Go Connemara, Connemara and Discover Ireland: Connemara for a variety of accommodation choices available in Connemara. All federations will be guided on specific accommodation options suitable to them and their budget once they indicate their numbers travelling.
