TRAIL WORLD CHALLENGE

Torhout, Belgium has the honour of being the hosts of the 100 km World Cup for a fourth time.

At this introductory event, two ultras are being contested --- 100km and 24 hours. The athletes from the commonwealth nations are excited and gearing up for an amazing event. Top athletes based on 2008 performances are Dominic Croft (men) and Emma Gooderham (women) for the 100 km, Martin Fryer (men) and Sharon Gayter (women) for the 24 hours.

50 KM WORLD TROPHY FINAL

The qualifying times are: 3:20 (men) and 3:50 (women)

IAU LABELED RACES

IAU provides labeling to ultra races around the world. This is an important mechanism of attracting racers to your event. Athletes in labeled races get included in the international ranking list for elite runners.

2008 was an exciting year with fast times/distances throughout the board. Let's take a look at the Races from last year.

6th IAU 24 HOUR WORLD CHALLENGE

Seoul, South Korea was the host city of the 6th Annual 24hr World Challenge on October 18th-19th 2008. The capital city with a population of 12 million people and the site of the 1988 Olympics Games, welcomed elite ultrarunners and federations of the IAU.

The race started in a sports ground like setting with an inner loop and outer perimeter. This design gave the athletes the allure of running in a stadium and also the opportunity to run in a quiet route. The entire loop was 920m encompassing the inner and outer perimeters.

The men's race was won for a three straight year by Japanese phenom Ryoichi Sekiya. The women's race was very close with the top two French runners finishing within 700 meters of one another as Anne-Marie Vernet out dueled Anne-Cecile Fonatine.

The team Competition was won by Japan (men's) with 785.432km and France (women's) with 708.755km.

The race was truly an exciting one and athletes are looking forward to the 7th Annual World Challenge in Bergamo, Italy.

21st IAU 100 KM WORLD CUP

Tarquinia, Italy was the venue selected for the 21st IAU 100km World Cup organized from Nov. 7th - Nov. 8th 2008.

This city, about 45 minutes from Rome, has numerous historical sites, beaches on the Mediterranean and pleasant country-side feeling. For three days Tarquinia was home away from home for visitors from thirty three countries.

This event was also the site of the IAU Congress organized on Nov. 7th and this was the opportunity for the federations to elect their executive council.

On Nov. 8th, the race started in Tuscania where runners took a 37 km route into Tarquinia. Once in the city, the athletes looped in four-14 km loops followed by a 7 km run leading through the walled city into the Piazza Cavour. The race finished about 1 km from City Hall, the site of the opening ceremonies. The race doubled up as the European Championship.

Race records were broken in both men's and women's races. Giorgio Calcaterra (Italy) won the men's race in 6:37:41. The women's race was won by Tatyana Zhirkova (Russia) in 7:23:33.

The team's competition (both World's and European) was won by Italy (men's) in 20:35:26 and Russia (Women's) in 22:58:51.
